She later graduated with a Master's of International Affairs from Columbia University in New York, where she also earned a writing fellowship.

Karla worked as a newspaper reporter before embarking on her television journalism career. She worked as a reporter and anchor in southern Minnesota and Ohio before returning to her home state for a reporting job at WCCO-TV. She soon decided to cross the street to her "TV home" at KARE 11, where you'll find her both reporting and anchoring.

At KARE, Karla has received multiple awards, including the prestigious Walter Cronkite Award for Excellence in Political Journalism. But she remains most proud of her advocacy work against Alzheimer's Disease and for refugees.
